
Interactive Presentations with Pear Deck

What is Pear Deck?

- Peardeck.com
- Pear Deck is an add-on.
- **Instructors** create and present interactive presentations
 - Monitor student input in real-time
- Students interact with presentations in real-time.
 - Respond to prompts on their own devices



How is this useful?

- Instructors can monitor in real time if and how well students comprehend and assimilate material.
- Core function: Real-time formative assessment.



Important caveats

- Requires access to Google Drive
 - Privacy
 - Account-specific
- Freemium service
 - Premium service for the first 90 days (good until the end of semester)
 - After that it is stripped to basic functionality (with premium features available via subscription)



Potential benefits

- Student interact with material in real-time.
- Instructors can assess students' interactions in real-time.
- Instructors can share student responses with class if needed.



Some challenges

- Difficult to build follow-ups to students answers
- Difficult for students to collaborate




How does Pear Deck work?


- An add-on to:

- Allows instructors to add interactive prompts to a presentation.



 Draggable questions take the form of agree/disagree or thumbs up/thumbs down






Pear Deck Interactive Slid

 of yes/no, true/false, or
 A, B, C, D
