Concentration in Portuguese Studies

A Concentration in Portuguese Studies was established in 2007 with eight courses for a minimum of 24 points.

Four required courses: PORT UN3101, PORT UN3300 (Favela and Carnival, Queer Sexualities in Brazil, among other topics), PORT UN3330, PORT UN3350.

Four electives: two courses must have the Portuguese (PORT) designation; two courses may be taken outside the Portuguese section but must have Lusophone content. Up to three courses taken abroad may count toward the concentration. A maximum of two courses taught in English may be counted toward the concentration overall.

Sharing ideas in the form of poems in various languages.







Portuguese Language Program

Portuguese is the sixth most spoken language in the world, with about 250 million speakers worldwide. It is spoken in Portugal, Brazil, Angola, Mozambique, Sao Tomé and Principe, Guinea-Bissau, the Cape Verde Islands, and East Timor. Thus the modern Luso-Brazilian world encompasses an astonishingly diverse array of cultures and has a long, rich, and complex history. Similarly, the cultural and economic rise of Brazil underscores the importance of the language.
