ANCIENT GREEK :::

You have never taken Greek before?

You can fulfill the language requirement in four semesters by taking the following series of classes: GREK 1101, 1102, 2101, 2102; passing 2102 means passing the language requirement. You can accelerate this process by taking Intensive Greek (1121), which covers the material of 1101 and 1102 in one semester. During the summer, we also offer an intensive intermediate class, which combines 2101 and 2102. (Warning: "Intensive" means intensive!)

You took Greek in high school?

You are a transfer student and have taken Greek at your previous institution? Contact the Classics Department Director of Undergraduate Studies for placement.

You want to fulfill the language requirement with Latin?

The Latin language sequence functions just like the Greek one. Unlike with Greek, however, the Classics Department offers a Latin placement test during NSOP week in the fall. You will be placed into a class at your level. NB: This placement is just a recommendation. You can always attempt a more advanced class, albeit at your own risk
