## A NOTE ON THE FIRST-YEAR CHINESE CURRICULUM

If you are planning to complete the <u>first-year curriculum of</u> <u>Chinese</u> at the Chinese Language Program, you can choose to do it in one of the following ways:

**A. The ordinary route:** Completing the first-year curriculum in 2 semesters

Fall 2023 (First-Year Chinese I, 5 credits) → Spring 2024 (First-Year Chinese II, 5 credits) **B. The slow route:** Completing the first-year curriculum in 3 semesters

Spring 2024 (Introductory Chinese A, 2.5 credits) → Fall 2024 (Introductory Chinese B, 2.5 credits) → Spring 2025 (First-Year Chinese II, 5 credits) **C. The fast route:** Completing the first-year curriculum in 1 semester

Fall 2023 (First Year Chinese II, 5 credits) This course is for students who have completed First-Year Chinese I or who have passed the Placement Exam to qualify for the class.

## **Additional Notes:**

- Introductory Chinese A (2.5 credits) + Introductory Chinese B (2.5 credits) = First-year Chinese I (5 credits)
- Students who complete Introductory Chinese A&B (2.5+2.5 credits) will continue with First-Year Chinese II (5 credits) to complete their first-year Chinese curriculum.

## CHINESE PLACEMENT EXAM

- The Placement Exam will be conducted **ONLINE via CourseWorks and Zoom**. The exam consists of a Written Test (Multiple Choice and Timed Composition, **8/23-8/30**, 3 hours) and a Speaking Test (**9/1**, 10 minutes). You will need to enroll in the Chinese Placement Exam System to take the exam.
